
What you need:

Thread and needles

Extra fine thread for lacework (white, yellow, pale yellow and color for body)

0.90 - 0.75mm needle

If you use thicker thread and needle, you can make a bigger bird in the same shape.



Other requirements

Black colored beads (4mm) 2

Polyester toy stuffing, Scissors, needle, black thread

Size (approximately):

W 6cm × H 4cm

Required motifs

Туре	quantity
Solid-color pentagon	2
Multi-color pentagon	2
Multi-color square	1


How to make motifs

As there are some variations of the motif, I show you the diagrams, which I use for little birds.

Instead of writing step-by-step procedure for this motif I added links to useful site. Please search "アフリカンフラワー 編み方 African flower pattern" for more information.




Pentagon




Square


How to join motifs

Joining motifs as follow:



After five motifs are finished,





- Pick up two soild-color pentagon motifs, sew three sides together (1)~
 (3)).
- Pick up two multi-color pentagon motifs, sew three sides together (4~
 ⑥).
- Sew a side of a multi-color pentagon motif and a side of soilid-color pentagon motifs together, twice(?)
 (3)
- 4. Stuffing. Sew each side of square motif to remaining side of pentagon motifs (9~12).

Eyes and beak

Sewing two black beads as eyes.

How to make beak



(US terms)

Rnd 1: 4 sc into a magic ring.

Rnd 2: ch1. 4 sc into every stitch of Rnd 1.

Rnd 3: ch1. *sc into the stitch, then 2 sc into the next stitch*. Repeat from * to *. Slip stitch to the beginning of the ch.

Sew the beak to the body.

For smaller birds


I made a smaller motif skipping round 2 by mistake. This causes a smaller bird.
